- Allow the utilities to **shut off your appliances at will** (smart-chipping).
- Allow the utilities to **sell your usage data** to the highest bidder. According to the utilities themselves, **the data will be worth more than the electricity they sell you.**
- Cause appliance short-outs, flickering lights, and fires.
- Allow the utility to shut off your power without coming to your home.

Analog Choice Bill (HB 4916) Call Your State Representative. It Takes 2 Minutes!

Not sure who your state rep is? You can quickly find them by calling your library or by going to <u>http://</u><u>house.michigan.gov/MHRPublic/</u>. (You are calling your *state* rep, not your *national* rep.) You can also call your state senator. Find them at <u>www.senate.michigan.gov/fysbyaddress.html.</u>

Phone calls carry 100 times more weight than an email. Please **CALL** your rep. Your rep is here to represent you, and the aides who answer the phone are usually nice. So don't worry. You can call during business hours, or call in the evening or the weekend and leave a message. **The important thing is that you CALL!** If you really don't want to call, then please do email them. Tell the aide who answers that you wish to speak to your rep. Always be polite and respectful to your representative. Tell your representative:

- Hello. My name is _____. I'm one of your constituents.
- I'm calling about HB 4916. I want a choice about whether to have a smart electric, gas, or water meter on my home.
- Tell them why you want customers to have a choice. Add anything else that is important to you about smart meters.

If you the rep is not available, recite these points to the aide. If you want your representative to call you back, let the aide know. **Remember: You always have a right to speak with your representative—they represent you!**
